Arrow straightening.

Wooden arrows.

Steam arrow over a kettle and gently bend straight. This is done by hand and eye, working your way along the shaft. (Wooden arrows are never straight)

Carbon and carbon aluminium arrows.

These are straight or broken. If you bend one of these arrows gentle and it creeks it is broken. You may not be able to see it but the carbon fibres will be damaged. It is no longer safe to shoot.

Aluminium arrows.

These can be straightened in several ways, but it is recommended to use a straightening jig.

The club has a jig which Gary looks after as maintenance man. He may also assist in arrow straightening advice.
