The first consultation has ended and we await the decision of Highways England's preferred route which should be announced next Spring.

If the route announced is 4/5 AV2 (the one that goes through our woods) we have been advised by Highways England that they have no legal obligation to consult with us, or offer any costs/compensation as we do not have a written tenancy agreement.

We have contacted our Landlord, and been offered a 5 year tenancy for an estimated cost of £1,500.00 to produce the required document.

The committee is now seeking our own solicitor to see if we have to go forward with the tenancy now, or whether we can wait until the route is announced.

If we do have to agree to a written tenancy, the costs will take up most of the clubs savings, and we will have to increase next years subs by £10.00 per person to recoup some of the money.

More information will be given to you at the AGM on February 28th.




It was the clubs 21st Birthday in November. Thanks to Dave and Dawn Terry for the great birthday cake.
